The project at **Rowde Church of England Primary School** has already completed its first phase with local author and illustrator, **Eileen Browne** working with **Reception, Year One and Two Children**, reading them a selection from her books. Eileen also talked about the process of getting them published, plus Diversity and Gender in the origin of the books.

The Second Project is in June and will involve the Senior Children, managed by the arts organisation, 'No Added Sugar', led by two professional artists who work in partnership with schools and other like environments, inspiring and tapping into artistic talent within children in many different ways. Each child will be provided with a wooden circle, which they are to design a decoration for, assembling them as a large exterior installation symbolising the theme, 'We Are Rowde', an ongoing theme within the school in the aftermath of Lockdown, celebrating being individuals, living and working together as a whole school within the community. . May Lecture

Lucia Gahlin's talk is entitled, 'Wonderful Things! Tutankhamun's Tomb and Treasures'.

Her lecture celebrates the discovery 100 years ago of this tomb by Howard Carter in 1922, arguably the greatest archaeological find of the 20th Century. The name of this boy-king conjures up wonderful imagery and mysterious tales of the Pharaohs.

Lucia's lecture will explore this unusual tomb and its iconic treasures; examine the design and decoration of one of the most famous tombs in the valley of The Kings. Discussing Carter's discovery of the tomb, and explores what happened to the amazing wealth of funerary goods found inside; from Tutankhamun's golden shrines to his ornate board games.

Lucia is an Egyptologist who works mainly in museums and on excavations in Egypt, but mostly lectures, having taught Egyptology at several UK universities. She is an Honorary Research Associate of the University College London's Institute of Archaeology. Lucia works at the Petrie Museum of Egyptian Archaeology in London and leads tours to Egypt.
