Linda Collins is to lead us through a cornucopia of Royal Art, as we discover, 'The Queen's Paintings on Public Display'.

When **Queen Elizabeth** came to the throne in 1953, she inherited a collection of paintings to rival any in the world. Paintings from the **Early Renaissance**, **Victorian** and through to today. Each an important reflection of the taste of the Monarch and the social, artistic and economic thinking of the time. **There are over 7,000 paintings in the Royal Collection**.
