# . July AGM and following Lecture: 'A Homage to The Humble Carrot.'

Anne Howarth's intention is to open our eyes to see the way this common vegetable has been able to inculcate itself into our lives, with a little help help from The House of Orange, not only onto our table, but into the art works through the ages. Born in ancient Persia and Central Asia, carrots travelled Westwards, along with more durable and costly commodities, via The Silk Road.

Anne's lecture, although light and humorous in spirit, has a seriousness at its heart; one dedicated to lifting this popular vegetable to new heights in our estimations, as a symbol of nationhood, abundance, quiet domesticity and a code for seduction.

Anne Howarth's background is as Senior Specialist in Ceramics for Bonhams and Christies in London. From 1995 to 2002, she was resident in Shanghai, China and gave lectures on the History of The China Trade and European Chinoiserie, to the international community of diplomats and expatriates in Shanghai and Beijing. On returning to London in 2002, Anne catalogued Chinese ceramics at Kensington Palace.

She is a lecturer at the Victoria and Albert Museum, the British Museum and the Queen's Gallery.
