Not that it was all fun and games. The intervening War Years had a dramatic affect on Peter Butterworth, who went from the merchant navy to the Royal Navy as a pilot in the Fleet Air Arm. Shot down and captured, he spent the rest of the war in Stalag Lufts and especially in number 3; the one of The Great Escape fame. There he was part of MI9, a conduit for getting servicemen back to England and knew all the escape team on the dig for freedom.

Best known for his hilarious roles in 14 of The Carry On films, Tyler's Dad was a byword for comic genius and was almost Dr Who instead of Patrick Troughton!

Mum, Janet Brown, the brilliant impressionist, also had a life full of fascinating and humorous stories: like meeting the Queen as Carol Channing and, when the real Carol turned up, singing a duet with her. Naturally, her most famous creation was playing Margaret Thatcher (with whom she had a long friendship).

. Next Lecture is on October 18th Grace Darling: The Fine Art of Saving Lives At Sea by James Taylor.

Grace is a historic figure and was the poster girl of the early RNLI. Her life story at Brownsman and Longstone Lighthouses, will include details of her time alongside artists, whose works kept her in the public eye well into the 1970's.

Brave and resourceful, her daring rescue of steamship passengers off the Northumberland coast in 1838, brought her international fame. In her story we will find more about her bravery and the life that surrounded her. Notably, Grace became the first woman to be awarded a medal for gallantry.

James Taylor, is a former Curator of Paintings and Prints at The National Maritime Museum, Greenwich. An author, his publications include: An Illustrated History of Marine Painting (1995), The Voyage of The Beagle – Darwin's extraordinary adventures (2008), , Dazzle – Disguise and Disruption in War and Art (2016) and Sir Joseph Banks and the Shipboard Artists of Captain's Cook and Flinders (2018).
