'The Empty Chair in Art; from Van Gogh to Ai Wei Wei' by Angela Findlay. Over the past 150 years, artists across the world – including Angela herself – have used the humble chair in a whole variety of art mediums; as a conduit for ideas, such as those on protest, war, absence, memory, domestic life and identity.

Angela's lecture will follow the empty chair through the art movements of the last century, including: Schiele, Magritte, Warhol, Beuys, Rauschenberg and many more.

Our Speaker is an artist, writer and lecturer, with a long career of teaching art in prisons in both England and Germany. Angela's interest in the redemptive role of art in society led to extensive research into Germany's complex Post-WW2 Process of Remembrance.

Remember her excellent lecture in November 2021 on Germany's Post WW2 Culture of Apology and Atonement? Quite an eye opener to understand their decision, as a nation, not to honour their war dead by having no commemorative statuary, only reminders of what they had allowed to happen? Angela's book on this—In My Grandfather's Shadow—published in 2022.
