Russell Nash will talk about, 'The Men Who Made Menswear'. Come and hear the story of men's tailoring over the past 200 years, told through the lives of the men who commissioned and created it. We'll hear about the designers and makers of places like Savile Row, Jermyn Street and many others and how they shaped the way men chose their outfits. These people were central to this growing cultural area and the wider cultural shifts since Regency times, which greatly affected how men and their women chose to attire themselves.

Russell trained and worked as an actor, writer, puppeteer and theatre maker for 15 years. In 2015 he qualified as a London Blue Badge Guide, regularly taking groups through the major galleries and museums in London, like The National Gallery, Tate Modern & Tate Britain and The British Museum. During Covid lock-downs, Russell devised and delivered more than 30 different Virtual Tours and Lectures to groups across the UK and world.
